Maker's mark: F.C — Frank Cobb & Co. Ltd., Sheffield [INTERPRETED — slightly worn but consistent with confirmed research]

Sheffield crown (assay office mark) — partially visible/worn [INTERPRETED]

Lion passant (sterling silver standard) — likely present but too worn/small to confirm definitively [UNCERTAIN]

Date letter: likely 'k' for 1909 Sheffield — small punch, difficult to read clearly [INTERPRETED]

Presentation inscription: 'Presented from Mr & Mrs S. Alter to their dear friends Mr & Mrs Krantz on their Silver Wedding 19th August 1909' [CONFIRMED]

2 History & Provenance

This imposing covered cup was crafted by Frank Cobb & Co. Ltd., a well-established Sheffield silversmithing firm that operated from the late nineteenth century through the early decades of the twentieth. Frank Cobb & Co. were noted producers of high-quality hollowware, particularly presentation silver, and were registered at the Sheffield Assay Office. The present example, standing on a circular spreading foot with a bold knopped stem and campana-shaped bowl surmounted by a domed cover with acanthus finial, represents their finest presentation-grade work. The entire surface is richly decorated with repoussé acanthus leaves, scrolling foliage, and gadrooned borders in the Baroque Revival manner so favoured by Edwardian silversmiths.

The piece is engraved with a presentation inscription recording its gift from Mr and Mrs S. Alter to Mr and Mrs Krantz on the occasion of their Silver Wedding anniversary, 19th August 1909. Such covered cups were the quintessential Edwardian gift for milestone celebrations — substantial, impressive, and designed to take pride of place on a dining room sideboard. The vigorous acanthus-leaf decoration and architectural form draw directly on early Georgian precedents, reflecting the historicist taste that dominated English silver design throughout the reign of Edward VII. The choice of a covered cup — a form with roots in seventeenth-century civic plate — underscores the formality and significance attached to silver wedding celebrations in this period.

The cup appears to be in good overall condition, with the repoussé decoration sharp and well-defined, and the engraved inscription clearly legible. The hallmarks on the foot rim show some wear but remain identifiable. There is a warm patina consistent with age but no visible damage, denting, or repair. In today's market, Edwardian presentation silver of this scale and quality commands steady interest, particularly when bearing clear Sheffield marks and a dated inscription. The personal inscription, while adding historical charm, may marginally limit appeal to some collectors. Given the current silver spot price and the decorative premium attached to pieces of this calibre, this lot would be expected to achieve a solid result at auction.
