2 History & Provenance

This distinguished four-piece tea and coffee service was produced by Argenteria Cassetti, the celebrated Florentine silversmithing house established in the heart of Florence. Cassetti has long been renowned for their commitment to traditional hand-raising and forming techniques — as explicitly attested by the 'FATTO A MANO' (handmade) stamp on each piece. The service comprises a coffee pot, teapot, covered sugar bowl, and cream jug, all sharing a striking bulbous globular body form with clean, unornamented surfaces that allow the brilliant polish of the sterling silver to speak for itself. The hollow tubular handles curve elegantly away from the body, and the short tapered spouts display refined proportions characteristic of expert Florentine craftsmanship.

Stylistically, the service exemplifies the Italian modernist design movement of the post-war era, when Italian silversmiths — particularly those in Florence, Milan, and Rome — embraced sculptural, organic forms that broke decisively with historical revivalism. The influence of mid-century Italian industrial design is evident in the simplified geometries, the emphasis on material quality over applied decoration, and the bold spherical volumes. Such pieces were conceived both as functional tableware and as design objects in their own right, reflecting the Italian design ethos that elevated everyday domestic objects to the level of art. The globular form recalls the work of such influential designers as Lino Sabattini and Gio Ponti, though Cassetti's interpretation maintains a warm, handcrafted quality distinct from machine-produced designs.

The service appears to be in very good overall condition, with the highly polished surfaces showing only minor surface scratches consistent with age and careful use — no denting, significant wear, or repairs are apparent from the images. Complete four-piece Italian sterling tea and coffee services of this quality are increasingly sought after in the current market, where mid-century and late 20th century Italian silver design has experienced strong appreciation. Cassetti's reputation for hand craftsmanship and the substantial weight of sterling in a full service — likely in the range of 60 to 90 troy ounces — places this set at a compelling position where both bullion value and design merit converge. At current silver spot prices (\$69.72/troy oz), melt value alone supports the lower estimate, while the design integrity, completeness of the set, and maker attribution command a significant premium.
