Assay master mark: C·O (Cyrillic) over 1894 — Russian Imperial provincial assay master, dated 1894 **[CONFIRMED]**

Silver standard: 84 zolotniki (875/1000 fineness) — Russian Imperial silver purity mark **[CONFIRMED]**

Trailing character after 84: small indistinct character, possibly city mark or Cyrillic 'й' **[UNCERTAIN]**

Maker's mark: E3 (Cyrillic E and 3, visually reads as E3) — unidentified Russian provincial silversmith **[CONFIRMED reading, maker identity UNCERTAIN]**

## 2 History & Provenance

This silver beaker (stakan) with its matching engraved saucer bears the mark of an unidentified Russian provincial silversmith working under the initials E3 (Cyrillic). The set was assayed in 1894 by the provincial assay master C.O. and struck with the 84 zolotniki purity mark, confirming a silver fineness of 875 parts per thousand. The beaker is of classic tapered cylindrical form and sits upon a circular saucer of complementary design. Both pieces feature finely executed bright-cut engraving: the beaker displaying an architectural townscape within a circular cartouche — depicting buildings with pitched roofs, a church spire, and what appears to be a waterfront — flanked by foliate sprays; the saucer echoing the theme with a central architectural roundel surrounded by four segmented panels of flowering botanical decoration.

The decorative programme is quintessentially Russian provincial in character, representative of a flourishing tradition of silverwork that thrived in northern Russian cities — particularly Kostroma, Vologda, and Viatka — during the second half of the nineteenth century. These provincial workshops produced silver wares of remarkable charm, their naive engraved townscapes offering idealized views of Russian civic and ecclesiastical architecture. The stakan-and-saucer form served the Russian tea-drinking ritual, where tea was traditionally poured from the cup into the saucer to cool before drinking. Made in 1894, during the final years of Alexander III's reign, this set belongs to a period of intense productivity in provincial Russian silversmithing before the hallmarking reforms of 1896 changed the system.

The set is in good condition, with the engraving remaining crisp and well-defined across both pieces. There is characteristic copper show-through at high-wear points — particularly the saucer rim and beaker base — which is typical and expected of 84 zolotniki silver with its 12.5% copper alloy content, and confirms genuine period use. No dents, repairs, or structural issues are apparent. Russian Imperial provincial silver of this type and date has a strong following among collectors, with particular appeal for its folk-art charm and historical resonance. Matched sets of beaker and saucer command a modest premium over individual pieces.
